Who are the Canadian Forces Military Police?

- The Canadian Forces Military Police is a combined service organization
- 1230 all ranks serving all three environments Navy, Army, and Air Force





- National Counter Intelligence Unit
- Military Security Guard Unit – Security to Canadian Embassies and High Commissions



Military Police Provide Support to the Canadian Forces

- Police Operations
- Security Operations
- Custody Operations









The Military Police is a Federal Police service with a unique dual jurisdiction.



Military Jurisdiction

For the purposes of the Military Justice System the Military Police exercise jurisdiction over all members of the Canadian Forces.

Civilian Jurisdiction

For the purposes of the civilian criminal justice system the Military Police may exercise jurisdiction over any civilian on Defence Establishments.

Canadian Forces Provost Marshal (CFPM)

- Establishes and enforces police policy and standards
- Commands the Canadian Forces National Investigation Service.
- Provides strategic direction to the CF MP Branch



CFPM Organization

Deputy Provost Marshals (DPMs):

- Police Operations
- Security
- Operations and Plans
- Resource Management
- Professional Standards



Complaints



- 121 complaints in 2005
- 44 were conduct complaints
- 76 Standards complaints
- 1 Interference



POLICING DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS

**(a) the conduct of an
investigation;**

**(b) the rendering of assistance
to the public;**

**(c) the execution of a warrant or
another judicial process;**





(d) the handling of evidence

(e) the laying of a charge;

(f) attendance at a judicial proceeding;

(g) the enforcement of laws;

(h) responding to a complaint; and

(i) the arrest or custody of a person.



Bill C-7



Sets out the duties and functions of the Canadian Forces Provost Marshal (CFPM)

Clarifies the responsibilities of the CFPM and the Military Police Complaints Commission.
