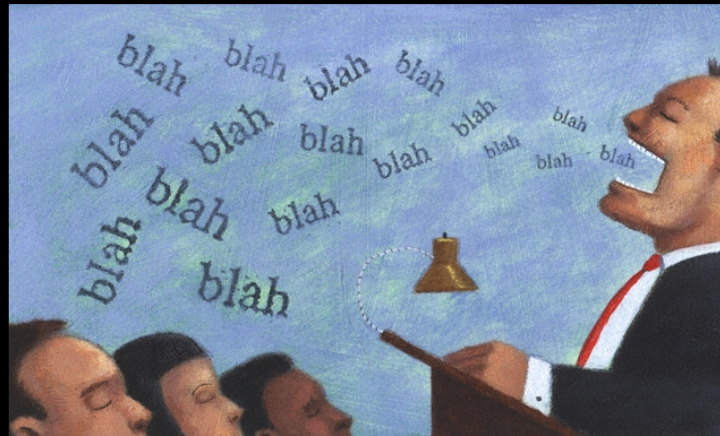

- Police Chief Joe Bloggs defended an officer who shot a man three times. The man allegedly lunged at an officer and a security guard with a knife.



Tuesday night... “The suspect then raised the knife over his head and lunged toward the officer...the man did not stop... He continued to move forward in a threatening manner with the knife and was shot a second time.” (the Chief) said.....

-Police Internal Affairs also has begun an investigation into whether the use of deadly force was justified.
